

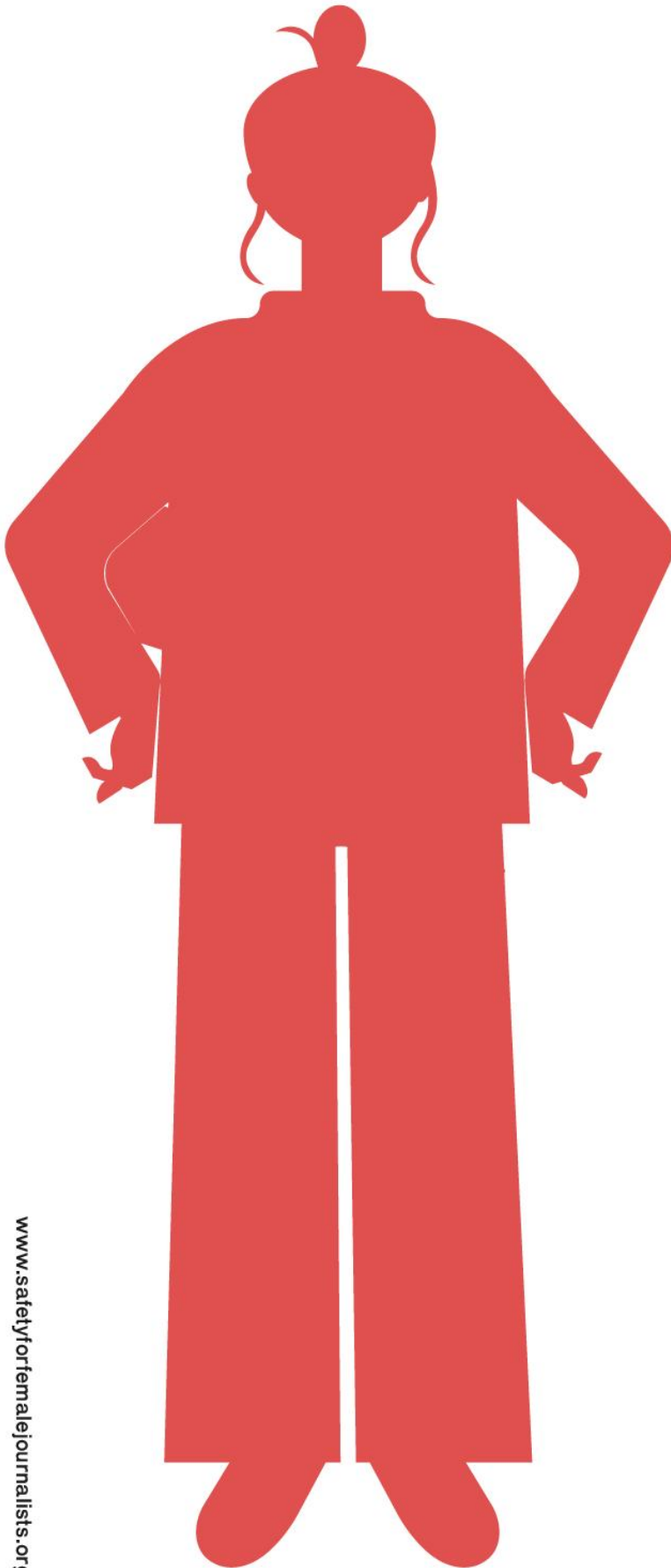
## The journalist

What steps should you take to protect yourself and your source?



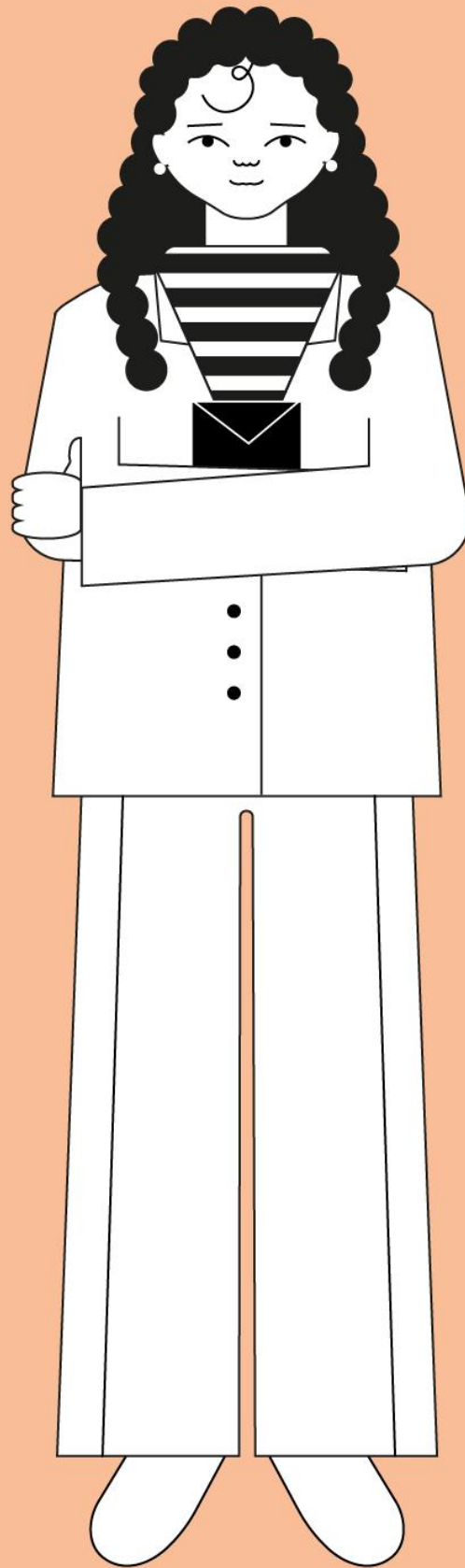

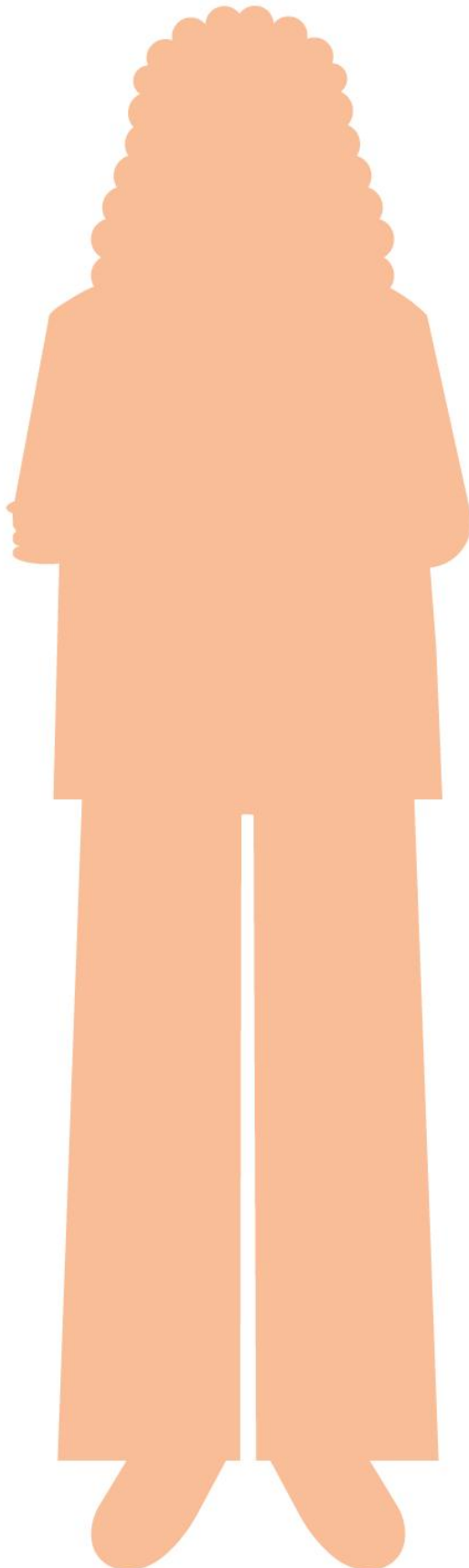
## **The editor**
